After being excused from the Bethel Meeting, the Bees will go to their meeting space.


Set Up: Applications for Membership Jemima Handout
Bible

Discussion of the Day: What are some of your favourite stories?

Activity of the Day: Ask the Bees "*why do you think we call this organization 'Job's Daughters?'*" and "*Do you know who Job is?'*" Explain that Job was a man who lived a long time ago and that his story can be found in the Bible. Show the Bees where to find this story in the Bible. Explain that this organization is called Job's Daughters because of this story. Give a short synopsis of the story (make it interesting! – Need some help? See the next page for a version just for Jobies-to-Bee! End by explaining that Job had three daughters and that we will learn more about each one of them over the year!

Show the Bees the Jemima handout. Explain that Job's first daughter was named Jemima and that her name means Dove. Talk about the information on the handout.

Meeting Wrap Up: Ensure to have collected contact information from the families so that they can be invited to further events. If your Bethel meets during the day, you may choose to stay for the Bethel Closing Ceremony and social time.

A long time ago, there was a man named Job. He was very kind, helped others, and always tried to do the right thing. He had a big, happy family and lots of friends.


One day, Job faced really hard times - he lost his things, his family had troubles, and he got very sick. Even when everything was tough, Job stayed patient and kind.

Discussion of the Day: Remind the Bees about Jemima and what her name means.

Activity of the Day: Ask the Bees “what do you think Jemima was like, if her name meant ‘dove’? What does a white dove make you think about? Where else have you seen the white dove used? What do you think that it means? Do you think it means the same thing in Job’s Daughters?” Give each Bee a copy of the Dove Handout and talk about the information on it. Discuss any questions the Bees may have.
