



# OCTOBER LEADER'S GUIDE

**First Meeting in October:** JB2Bs will attend the Bethel's Opening Ceremony. Bees should be invited to participate in the Circle of Prayer before the meeting begins. If the Bethel has a JB2B flag, one Jobie to Bee will present the flag during the opening ceremony. If many Bees are interested, have them take turns each meeting.

After being excused from the Bethel Meeting, the Bees will go to their meeting space with the Beekeeper or another designated adult.


**Discussion of the Day:** What is a tradition?


**Activity of the Day:** Ask the Bees about traditions in their families. If they struggle to come up with ideas, ask them about what they do for family birthdays, holidays, Thanksgiving and Christmas.

**Discussion of the Day:** What is your favourite flower?

**Activity of the Day:** In Job's Daughters we have an official flower of the organization. It is the Lily of the Valley. Show the Bees what a Lily of the Valley looks like. Explain that it looks kind of like little bells hanging off of a stem. It also sort of looks like girls with their heads bowing in prayer, like members of Job's Daughters do at parts of their meeting.

Give the Bees the Lily of the Valley handout and use it as conversation starter. Give the Bees the Lily of the Valley colouring sheet.
